## *From Our Pastor*

“We’ve had a lot of change lately.” She made that statement as the congregational council was discussing a matter on our agenda—not really as an argument for one choice or another, just as an observation. It got me thinking about how we deal with change and how hard it can be.

Somewhere I read that part of the stress inherent in being human is that we are wired to want continuity and predictability, while simultaneously craving novelty. We hate big changes in our routine but we also hate being bored. Give us too many changes in a short period of time and we get anxious; give us too few and we quickly become lethargic and disengaged. Finding the balance is hard; we often feel rip-sawed between too much flux in our lives and too little. Too much change in a short period spikes our insecurity, but it’s hard to stay enthusiastic when we are playing out the same script over and over.


We find that tension in our work, our families, and also in our church. We want new things to happen in the life of our parish but we mourn when familiar patterns change. As one wag put it, “Everybody wants to go to heaven, but nobody wants to die.” But the core of the gospel is that there cannot be resurrection until there is death. There has to be an ending of the old and some risk before new possibilities can emerge.

When you have a community of people trying to be the church together you will have some who much prefer continuity and others who want to shake things up and try something new. I name this tension in the hope that doing so will help us work together to find the sweet spot where tradition and innovation meet.

In a given day I meet both those deeply grieving the loss of things they value and those who are chaffing under the unwillingness of the church (local and universal) to dare new things. My hope is that whatever our preference regarding change—whether our default is to resist it or embrace it—we can hear the pain and struggle of those who are different from us. That is part of what trying to be the church is all about, looking beyond our personal preferences to care about others who are part of the same body of Christ.

The truth: Luther Memorial is changing—too fast for some, not nearly fast enough for others. But we are changing. From construction outside the fellowship hall, to a new worship time, to a creative approach to confirmation, to testing new liturgies, to trying some new program which has yet to emerge, we are always trying to keep the security of the familiar while cultivating faithfulness which responds to fresh challenges.

The early church was called “the way.” They understood that they were on a journey and the only constant was the desire to follow where Jesus led them. I pray for that spirit among us as we enter into a new program year together.

## GET INVOLVED!

**Men's Bible Study Resumes:** After a summer break, the Men's Bible Study will resume on Wednesday, August 30 at 7:30am, in the Campus Center. Join us for this hour of fellowship, study of the coming week's gospel lesson, and prayer.

**Thursday Faith Discussion Group Studies Great Christians:** Beginning August 31, at 10:00am, in the conference room, the Thursday Faith Discussion Group will resume its DVD course, *The Apocalypse: Controversies and Meaning in Western History*. We are exploring the text and significance of the book of Revelation. Each week we will hear a lecture on this theme—and use that as jumping off point to discuss challenges of faith in our own day.

**Luther Forum:** In honor of the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the beginning of the Reformation, the Luther Forum will begin the year with a DVD course entitled *Reformation Roots*. This course explores how the Reformation came to be and how a movement birthed in Germany spread to other countries and sparked some of the denominations we see today.

**Wednesday Morning Exercise Group:** We have a group of seniors that meet in the Fellowship Hall each Wednesday morning at 10:30am to exercise using instructional DVDs. All of our DVDs offer exercises from a chair. A few of them involve us using light weights and/or stretch bands. We exercise using Pilates, aerobics, tai chi, balance, strengthening, yoga and chair dance DVDs. This is a great opportunity for those who find exercising alone a commitment challenge. Please join us at any time. The fellowship combined with getting healthy is so motivating!

**Micah's Backpack Sign Up:** Luther Memorial will be responsible for delivering Micah's Backpack to Kipps Elementary School during the 2017-18 school year. MBP ensures that children on reduced or free lunch have food to eat over the weekend. Bags are picked up at St. Michael Lutheran Church on Thursday evening or Friday morning of each week. They are delivered to Kipps between 9 and noon on Friday. **The signup sheet to deliver a week or more is on the mailboxes in the narthex.**

**Shelter Fest is Coming:** Shelter Fest is a fundraising event sponsored by To Our House, the ministry with homeless men which our congregation hosts each year. This year Shelter Fest will be Saturday, August 26, beginning at 5:30, Sinkland Farms, in Riner. Details will be forthcoming.

**Lord's Table:** During the growing season, members with surplus produce from their gardens are invited to bring it in and leave it on the "Lord's Table" in the fellowship hall. When you worship pick up something and leave a donation which will be given to the ELCA's Hunger Appeal.

The Blacksburg Refugee Partnership has put together a summer tutoring and recreational program for the client families. There are more than 30 volunteers for the children, and an additional 12 for the adults. Thank you to those who have volunteered to help in this important aspect of helping the families to assimilate.

One of the mothers will soon give birth to her fifth child. The BRP is organizing a diaper drive and an online wish list. More details to follow.

Each family has a liaison (oversees all aspects of living in the USA), a health coordinator, and recreation coordinator. There is one family that has just lost their recreation coordinator and we are looking for a new volunteer. This person would help the families get their children involved in area sports (soccer is very popular), movies, entertainment events in Blacksburg (4<sup>th</sup> of July activities), swimming lessons etc. This person is not responsible for taking all the children to and from activities. There are others who help with driving. The ages of the children are 14, 12, 10, and 3. - Update or confirm **your** information. Enter a participating organization's number. The LMLC number is 82292.
- Click on confirm.

When you use your Kroger Plus card, a portion of the sale will be directed to the organization you have chosen. Kroger requires that you periodically re-link your card to an organization. So if you have not done this lately, you may need to re-link your card.


